Easter Joy!

"When it was evening on that day...Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord."

John 20:19-20

During this Easter season, we can still feel the wonder and the awe, the very excitement of that first Easter. We too, can experience joy, the same joy that filled the disciples when they recognized their risen Lord. We all, either on Easter Sunday morning or sometime during this season want to revisit that incredible moment, when in our heart of hearts, we know that Christ is Risen.

There is the story of a family that had been utterly devastated when they received news that their son had been killed in a battle. But days later, you can imagine the joy of receiving word that the son was alive. He had been seriously wounded but was alive. The family was completely overjoyed.

Like in this passage of scripture, on that Easter evening, the stunned and frightened disciples, recognized Jesus. Yes, his wounds were visible, but he was alive. On Easter Sunday, when we sing "Christ the Lord is Risen today", by the power of the Holy Spirit our souls are reassured that Jesus lives forever more. But after that moment, after we have experienced joy and the worship subsides, we go out into the world, reaffirming our Mission. As Christians, as followers of Jesus, we have been commissioned, just like the disciples, "As the father has sent me, so I send you." (John 20:21)

This Easter has a new significance for us at Fairview. We are now "disaffiliated" from the United Methodist Church. Now what? After disaffiliation what do we do? Now we could waste even more precious time by stewing over who the next pastor will be, or whether or not we will remain "free agents" or join another denomination. BUT...we have a calling. All of us. The proclamation of the Gospel is the church's mission...it is the mission of Fairview. It is what we are called to do. We come together for worship, for nurturing in the faith, and for fellowship, but we are ultimately sent out to bear witness to the Gospel in our neighborhoods and workplaces, to our schools, to the needy and to the infirmed. This is who we are. The "calling" is not left up to the pastor, or the Administrative Council. The calling is not only for those who are younger, but even for the young at heart. Each follower of Jesus is a missionary. In your own unique way, you are to bring others to the Lord.

So now in this "Eastertide", we have been empowered with the gifts of the Holy Spirit, to continue to be the church, to be Fairview, just as you have been for over 100 years. Once again, we have been overjoyed to know for certain that Jesus is Alive. Now let us go forth as His disciples.

Bishop Dickson is the pastor of Ng'ambwa Pentecostal Church Taita Taveta, Kenya. He is the Director of Heartbeat High School, the church's ministry. Along with the high school, Ng'ambwa Pentecostal Church helps orphans by educating them. They minister to widows and empowering them by small-scale businesses to get a living and take care of their children. They help the community, by drilling wells to provide water for the people. Additionally, Bishop Ochuto oversees 13 churches in Kenya, Africa. Bishop Dickson comes to the US yearly and raises funds to support the ministry in Kenya.

He will be at churches in Pennsylvania, Indiana, Ohio, North and South Carolina and Virginia. Please come join us and support his ministry.
