THANKSGIVING ISN'T ALWAYS EASY...

Martin Rinkert was a minister in the little German town of Eilenburg some 350 years ago. He was the son of a poor coppersmith, but he managed to work his way through one of the finest educations of the day. In 1617, after years of study and hard work, he was offered the post of archdeacon in his hometown parish. A year later, what has come to be known as the Thirty-

Years War broke out, and his town was caught in the middle of the conflict. In 1637, a massive plague that swept across the European continent hit Eilenburg; people died at the rate of fifty per day, and the man called upon to bury most of them was Martin Rinkert. In all, over 8,000 people died, including Martin's own wife. His labors finally came to an end just one year after the conclusion of the war. His ministry spanned 32 years, all but the first and the last overwhelmed by the great conflict and plague that engulfed his town. He endured some of the most difficult circumstances imaginable in his time... they were certainly difficult circumstances in which to be thankful. But he managed to give thanks to God nevertheless, and he wrote these words for his time and for all time:

Now thank we all our God With heart and hands and voices; Who wondrous things hath done, In whom his world rejoices.

It takes an incredible, grace-filled spirit to come through such hardship and yet express such gratitude to God. However, Rinkert never lost sight of the "wondrous things" God has done in and through His Son Jesus Christ; deliverance from sin is indeed something for which followers of Christ around the world can always give thanks, regardless of personal or societal circumstances. Brett Blair writes, "Here is a great lesson. Surrounded by tremendous adversity, thanksgiving will deliver you…with heart and hands and voices."

The past few years...and, indeed, this past year...have not been easy for our congregation or, in reality, for any congregation. Nevertheless, God has been at work in grace-filled ways! In this Thanksgiving season, may the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you, bless you, and "deliver you... with heart and hands and voices."

Thank you for your ministry; it is a privilege to serve as your pastor!

Dear Members and Friends of Fairview Church:

My first three months of ministry with you have been among the most enjoyable of my ministry. I am incredibly blessed to serve as your pastor; you are a wonderful congregation filled with people of faith and integrity! Let me again thank you for the thoughtful gifts you shared with me for both Pastor Appreciation Month in October and for my recent birthday. It is a joy to be among you!

I'm writing to share three items with you:

- 1) Following our worship service on Sunday, November 12th, we will hold a Ministry Fair in our narthex. Our three vital ministries of Worship, Discipleship (formerly Education), and Evangelism will offer you an opportunity to learn more about what they do and when they do it. Sign-ups will be available for those interested in serving one of the Ministry Teams in 2024 or perhaps in serving on a rotating basis on one of our weekly service teams (such as our Tech Team for Worship, our Greeters Team for Evangelism, or our 2024 VBS Volunteers Team for Discipleship). Spiritual gift inventories will be available to you as a guide to discovering your God-given talents for ministry if you wish to use one. Be sure to check our information table in the back of our sanctuary following worship for more information. As we celebrate the sacrificial service of our Veterans on that weekend, we will also celebrate the opportunity to serve Christ in ministry through our church!
- 2) In our worship service on Sunday, November 19th, we will celebrate Stewardship Sunday as we receive financial pledge cards through our Consecration Sunday program. At our church conference on October 29th, we approved our church budget for 2024; copies will be available for you to take home and review following worship on November 5th and November 9th. Each of those services will also feature a member or family of our congregation sharing a Stewardship Moment to talk about the blessings of Christian giving. Please know that a stewardship campaign is not about finding a way to raise more money or putting a "guilt trip" on members who may not be able to give very much financially. It's simply a way to make sure that our budget reflects the resources we believe God will provide for us in the coming year. I decided 36 years ago in my first pastoral assignment that I would never review records of financial giving in any church I served; giving is a matter between congregational members and God (and, for required tax purposes, our financial secretaries!). My primary interest is in serving you as best I can as a pastor and helping you grow in your faith, regardless of your ability to give. I'm as excited (probably more so) for our Ministry Fair results as I am for our Stewardship Campaign results!
- 3) If we have not yet had the chance to meet or talk extensively, I would greatly appreciate the opportunity to get to know you better. Immediately following worship on Sunday, December 10 and Sunday, December 17, I invite you to join me for a "Christmas Coffee with the Pastor" for a few minutes of conversation. If you like, I'll even take a "selfie" of us for my phone to help me better remember names and match them with faces!

I'm excited for the future of Fairview Church, and I'm excited to join you in worship over the weeks ahead. May God bless you!
