



FROM PASTOR STAN WRIGHT

It has only been 5 days since history was made for Fairview Church. The Disaffiliation! It has been an unusual journey since we started the whole process back in July. I have spent many hours in prayers over the matter, first asking God for wisdom for all members in making the decision and then hours, thinking about my own decision. It was not until the first of December that I got the final decision of our District

Superintendent about what choices I had for the future.

With the final decision made just 5 days ago, Reverend Bates, announced my future a bit premature. There were only two choices: withdraw from the United Methodist Church myself, which is long process with several interviews and the surrender of my credentials, my orders. Or, "re"-retire. I was concerned that my decision would somehow affect the church vote. She, Reverend Bates, wanted me to announce my decision before Christmas. I thought this would have been a very inappropriate time, right at Christmas, so I did not announce to the whole church my decision. Reverend Bates did that for me. I would have preferred telling you myself, but it's ok now.

At first I thought I would have to retire again immediately, but the disaffiliation process will go on at least for another 90 days, even after the February Annual Conference. I have requested to at least stay until the end of our normal conference year...June. We shall see what takes place. I pray this will give our church adequate time to search for a new pastor.

It has been an honor and privilege to be with you all. I think when I was asked to come and see the church through COVID, that it would have only been through June of 2021, but God blessed us and knit us together in an unusual way. If I were 25 years younger, I would definitely have withdrawn from the UMC so I could stay with you all. I think God has truly blessed our time together. I love Fairview and will always have a special place in my heart for all of you.

In the scripture lesson for this past Sunday, Paul writes in Philippians 3:13 "...forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." That is my prayer now for Fairview. You have a great legacy from a wonderful past in ministry, but now perhaps, as a church, you should press on into the future. A future with new blood in ministry, to begin to guide Fairview into another 100 years. You all have a new opportunity to search, pray and invite someone new to be your pastor, not assigned one from the Bishop. The entire congregation now will have a voice in who the leadership will be into the future. This should be the time of great discernment and prayer, asking God to send someone to you.

Thank you for a blessed time that we have had together. I truly think God anointed our time together.

We are also blessed to have men, women and youth who meet to purchase and set up the food (Christi Ragsdale), teams that fill the bags with food, and then deliver (Neal and Christi Ragsdale) these bags before they go to work on Wed morning.

Due to the economy, especially food prices, the generous grant does not always cover the food costs for the entire year. We are so grateful for all of our members who share in the cost of the food. History of Valentine's Day

Valentine's Day, also called Saint Valentine's Day or the Feast of Saint Valentine, is celebrated annually on February 14. It originated as a Christian feast day honoring one or two early Christian martyrs named Saint Valentine and, through later folk traditions, has become a significant cultural, religious, and commercial celebration of romance and <u>love</u> in many regions of the world.

There are a number of martyrdom stories associated with various Valentines connected to February 14, including an account of the imprisonment of Saint Valentine of Rome for ministering to Christians persecuted under the Roman Empire in the third century. According to an early tradition, Saint Valentine restored sight to the blind daughter of his jailer. Numerous later additions to the legend have better related it to the theme of love: an 18th-century embellishment to the legend claims he wrote the jailer's daughter a letter signed "Your Valentine" as a farewell before his execution; another tradition posits that Saint Valentine performed weddings for Christian soldiers who were forbidden to marry.


The 8th century Gelasian Sacramentary recorded the celebration of the Feast of Saint Valentine on February 14. The day became associated with romantic love in the 14th and 15th centuries when notions of courtly love flourished, apparently by association with the "lovebirds" of early spring. In 18th-century England, it grew into an occasion in which couples expressed their love for each other by presenting flowers, offering confectionery, and sending greeting cards (known as "valentines"). Valentine's Day symbols that are used today include the heartshaped outline, doves, and the figure of the winged Cupid. Since the 19th century, handwritten valentines have given way to mass-produced greeting cards. In Italy, Saint Valentine's Keys are given to lovers "as a romantic symbol and an invitation to unlock the giver's heart", as well as to children to ward off epilepsy (called Saint Valentine's Malady).

Saint Valentine's Day is not a public holiday in any country, although it is an official feast day in the Anglican Communion and the Lutheran Church. Many parts of the Eastern Orthodox Church also celebrate Saint Valentine's Day on July 6 in honor of Roman presbyter Saint Valentine, and on July 30 in honor of Hieromartyr Valentine, the Bishop of Interamna (modern Terni).
