UNEXPECTED ENCOUNTERS

In the ninth chapter of the New Testament Book of Acts we meet Saul, a zealous student of the Jewish law determined to stamp out the threat he believed was posed by the Christian faith...and to do so by any means necessary. On his way to the city of Damascus to arrest Christians in the local Jewish synagogues and take them as prisoners back to Jerusalem, the

Lord Jesus unexpectedly confronts Saul in a vision of blinding light. Jesus asks Saul, "Why do you persecute me?" Saul asks, "Who are you, Lord?" The Lord replies, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do." Physically blinded by the experience, Saul is led into the city, unable or unwilling to eat or drink for three days.

Jesus subsequently appears in an unexpected vision to Ananias, one of His followers in Damascus, and instructs him to go to Saul and place his hands on him to restore Saul's sight. Saul's murderous reputation had preceded him, and Ananias is clearly reluctant to even go near him. But the Lord says, "Go," and Ananias faithfully carries out Jesus' instruction. As a result, the persecutor Saul is healed and baptized, and he becomes the Apostle Paul. Christianity spreads to Europe through his ministry, and we have much of our New Testament thanks to the inspired writings of Saul/Paul.

I'm going to take a wild guess and say that, if you have any political leanings or inclinations at all, this election year is probably not generating entirely positive feelings about everyone you know on social media. Let's be honest: American society is largely tribalized at this point, with most folks seeing life through the lens of "us versus them." There appears to be less and less "united" left in the ideal that is the United State of America. As a people, we are separated politically, economically, and culturally in ways that would have been unthinkable during the World Wars of the last century, or even following the tragedies of 9/11 twenty-three years ago. Yet here we are, more uncomfortable with interacting with others with whom we differ/disagree than ever before. What a challenge for our country...and, frankly, what a challenge for the Church.

This is where the Book of Acts is so instructive for us today. The book is filled with accounts of the miraculous acts of Jesus's apostles as they carried on His ministry through the power of the Holy Spirit (hence the title of the book). But the greatest miracle recorded in the Book of Acts may be the overarching theme of faithfulness to Jesus' Great Commission to take the Gospel to the world. Time and again, in a world in which political and cultural division alienated people from each other in a way not altogether unlike our time, followers of Jesus responded to His unexpected invitations and opportunities to reach out to others with whom they had little or nothing in common. They overcame their political/cultural barriers and their ingrained fears to offer the Gospel to EVERYONE...and they "turned the world upside down" in the process!

Two thousand years later, the Gospel still has the power to turn the world upside down as we faithfully follow Jesus into a spiritual posture and lifestyle that lives out the world-embracing Great Commission to "make disciples of all nations." Ananias was willing to approach "the last person on earth he wanted to meet" with the life-changing Good News of Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. He was faithful to Christ's call by making an unexpected appearance in the life of Saul, and he literally changed the world as a result.

Jesus is still calling His followers to make unexpected appearances in the lives of the last people in the world we think we would ever want to encounter, including those with whom we may disagree politically (and those who may get on our nerves on social media!). He is still calling us to build relationships, show grace and mercy, and share His Gospel in word and deed. It's the way He has chosen to change the world over the past 2000 years, and He's still doing it today.

Is He giving you an opportunity today to make a surprising and grace-filled "unexpected appearance" in someone's life? If so, it's your chance to "turn the world upside down."

As always, I am grateful for the privilege of serving as your pastor!

SECURITY TEAM UPDATE

Fairview Church Security

In these days of increased riots and public shootings, you should know that Fairview Church has undertaken to deal with such violence should it occur at our church facilities.

Currently, we have the beginnings of a Safety/Security team consisting of about 10 church members; these members are now receiving training from a national organization which specializes in dealing with such violence in church settings across the country. The training emphasizes a structured approach for how we deal with each of the various situations that could arise.

It is expected that most of our team will complete this training by the end of August, and we will implement the plan's procedures by the Fall of 2024. You will be able to easily identify the Safety/Security Team members by the arm bands which they will wear each Sunday. The primary thrust of our plan is to ensure that threats are confined to the outside of the church building.

A part of the plan necessitates that all church members be made aware of the importance of obeying verbal instructions from the Safety/Security Team Leader, as well as comply with other "do's and don'ts", in the event that we receive security threats here at Fairview.

Soon, the team will make a preliminary presentation to familiarize all of you with the pertinent facets of the plan; further, you will be given documents or charts which describe how you may be affected if such verbal instructions are given.
