B.L.E.S.S. DURING LENT!

On Ash Wednesday (March 5th), our congregation begins the annual journey through the season of Lent. Lent is the 40-day period leading up to the celebration of Easter. The word is derived from the Anglo-Saxon word for *spring*, when the days *lengthen*.

Lent calls us to prepare to celebrate Easter by confronting the reality of human sinfulness (both individually and collectively) and remembering why the necessary sacrifice of Jesus upon the cross and His subsequent resurrection are the most important events in all of human history.

Recently I came across the following article from The Crossing Church in Columbia, Missouri, which speaks to the use – and misuse – of the Lenten season:

The Lenten tradition is rich with beauty—giving language to biblical practices and providing a healthy outlet to use them as a reminder of our need for Jesus. However, there is a history of Christians misusing Lent. This happens when Lent becomes:

Duty-driven:

I give up (fill in the blank) because that's what God wants from me.

Approval-driven:

I give up (fill in the blank) to prove to God that I love him.

Bargaining:

I give up (fill in the blank) so God gives me what I want from him.

Ritualistic:

I do it every year because that's what a good Christian does.

All of these are human attempts to bend Lent to our will instead of God's will. Remember, Lent is not a biblical command, so we don't have to observe it. But there is something rich and beautiful that happens when we use Lent to practice dying to our earthly comforts to refocus on our need for Christ. God can use Lent to transform our hearts, minds, and lives.

We can also use Lent to re-focus on the world's need for Christ...beginning with those who are already in our network of immediate relationships.

During Lent our message series will be shaped by the book *B.L.E.S.S.: 5 Everyday Ways to Love Your Neighbor and Change the World* by Dave Ferguson and Jon Ferguson. They write: "When you've been transformed by God's love, you can't help but want others to experience the same grace and freedom. But how do you share it without scaring them away or offending them? There are five simple, straightforward practices that will allow any believer to do just that. And by consistently living them out, you can affect not just individual lives but your entire neighborhood and community – one person at a time."

The season of Lent is a great time to make room in our lives for these practices. I hope you'll join us on the Sundays during Lent as we allow God to "transform our hearts, minds, and lives."
